## June 5, 2016 – Tenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

### Exegesis on this Sunday's readings

*1 Kings 17:17-24 | Psalm 30:2, 4, 5-6, 11, 12, 13 | Galatians 1:11-14a, 15ac, 16a, 17, 19 | Luke 7:11-17*

Some people are thinkers. They find out the facts and ponder over the data. Others are feelers. They get their direction from inside—from a “gut feeling.” Logic is not the most reliable guide for them. One way to face the world is not necessarily better than the other. Each has its merits and distractions. That is why our creative world is full of artists and engineers, poets, playwrights, and composers as well as accountants, computer programmers, and architects. The world needs the gifts of all to function as a whole.

In the readings for today, we find indications of how God's plan calls for diversity and actually uses it. In Hosea, we hear that sincerity is more important than the proper ritual. In the Gospel, John calls both the Pharisees and the tax collectors to him, each in their own way. Jesus draws people through their heads and through their hearts. The common ground is the call within the faith community.

Jesus calls each of us in a way that allows us to be open to Christ's message. For some, it is in study of our church writings such as Scripture, encyclicals, or letters from the bishops. Others hear God's voice through the liturgy or in sacred music, art, and in service to others. However we “work” at listening to God, God will speak to our hearts.

### **From the Rector's Desk**

Dear Cathedral Family:

The good news of God's word today is that only God truly creates; God can make something out of nothing. We, as human creatures, can never create in the same way that God does since we can only make something out of something. So what does this mean for our daily living?

It means that God can restore us to life even in the most desperate of situations. The widows in the first reading and the gospel were in such a situation as they dealt with the death of their sons. They thought all hope for life was lost, but God knew better. God restored their sons to life. When nothing seems possible, God makes it possible.

It means that God can forgive us and help us to change no matter how evil our behavior has been. St. Paul recounts how he had sinfully persecuted the Church before Christ was revealed to him. When we have been nothing but evil, God gives us the grace to become something wonderful and new.

It means that, when we are tempted to give up on life or ourselves, we need to give in to God; to surrender to God's love. God gives us hope and makes us new persons in Christ.
