## Cathedral Renewal Campaign

### **Cathedral Basilica Honored for 175 Years**

On May 23<sup>rd</sup>, Msgr. Gary Secor and Clara Barnes (Cathedral Renewal Campaign consultant) attended the Historic Hawaii Foundation Preservation Awards to accept recognition for the Cathedral's Dodrans-bicentennial – 175 Year Anniversary. Also present at the awards ceremony were Barbara Shideler of Mason Architects, the lead architect on the Cathedral's renovation project; and Virginia Murison, a historic preservation architect who prepared an extensive report on the history of the building in preparation for the restoration and preservation of the Cathedral Basilica.

The Cathedral Basilica will celebrate the 175th dedication anniversary on August 16, 2018. All are invited to attend a special Mass, including the blessing of the renovated sanctuary and new Bishops' Burial Chapels, beginning at 6:00 p.m. in the Cathedral Basilica and presided by Bishop Larry Silva.

The Cathedral Basilica, dedicated in 1843, is undergoing comprehensive renovations to restore her to her own nineteenth century appearance, in recognition of the time that Saints Damien and Marianne worshipped here. The minimum amount needed to fund the remainder of the project, and associated expenses, is \$15 million.

# June 10, 2018 – 10<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time

## Exegesis on this Sunday's readings

*Genesis 3:9-15 | Psalm 130:1-2, 3-4, 5-6, 7-8 | 2 Corinthians 4:13 – 5:1 | Mark 3:20-35*

Today's passage gives us a rather unique perspective on the identity of Jesus vis-à-vis his contemporaries. Often we are so imbued with stories from other gospels and preaching from years of attending Mass, that it can be challenging to hear a gospel story on its own terms, unencumbered by other material. But today's gospel reminds us that Jesus did not have it easy. Are we expecting the same? Today self-righteous Christians may think they are persecuted for their faith when in fact they may be obnoxious. Jesus was misunderstood not because obnoxious behavior, aloofness, or one-upmanship, but because he enjoyed the company of "sinners." He ate with those who were considered of ill repute. He engaged those who were said to be with demons. He did not fast but enjoyed great dinner parties. His behavior embarrassed his family and those who preferred cultural norms that kept certain people on the margins. It's one thing to admire Jesus. It's quite another to act as he did. Many of us are admirers of Jesus.

## From the Rector's Desk

Dear Cathedral family:

The battle cry of evil is: "divide and conquer". Satan will always try to get people divided against each other. This is what the scribes were trying to do in today's gospel as they tried to encourage Christ's relatives to stop him by claiming that he was possessed. In the first reading from Genesis, the immediate effect of the sin of Adam and Eve was to cause them to feel that they were divided from God and needed to hide from God. It also caused them to be divided from each other and to blame each other for their transgression.

When we feel divided from God, we are tempted to think that we don't need God's forgiveness and don't ask for it. We risk sinning against the Holy Spirit. In contrast to this attitude, Christ reminds us that we are all his brothers and sisters of Christ, especially when we do God's will. Paul's letter indicates that this relationship is the source of all the grace that we need for living and for dealing with the inevitable afflictions of life.

This is the real source of hope for our daily living in our "earthly dwelling". And it gives us the confidence to believe that a more perfect dwelling is waiting for us in heaven.
