## Living the Liturgy

- Leprosy, also known as Hansen's Disease, does not affect many people today. But Saint Damien of Molokai, who lived from 1840 –1889, was a Belgian missionary priest who ministered to those with the disease who were quarantined on the island of Molokai in Hawaii. In 1889, he became ill and died of the disease. He became a saint a year ago on October 11, 2009. You may wish to read more about him.
- Dr. Albert Schweitzer won the 1952 Nobel Peace Prize for humanitarian medical missionary work in Africa from 1933 to 1965, helping those in need. In 2004, Wangari Maathai became the first African woman and environmentalist to win. Research other Nobel Peace prize winners. How have some been an example of care for the poor or the earth?

# Oct. 11, 2020 – Twenty-eight Sunday in Ordinary Time

## Exegesis on this Sunday's readings

*Isaiah 25:6-10a / Psalm 23:1-3a, 3b-4, 5, 6 / Philippians 12:12-14, 19-20 / Matthew 22:1-14 or 22:1-10*

After Naaman, a foreign army leader, is healed by the God of Israel he is convinced this is the true God. He could not remain in Israel he took some soil to maintain the contact with the God of Israel. Naaman's experience reinforces Israel's conviction that their God's power extends to the ends of the earth. The psalm affirms what we have heard in the story of Elisha and Naaman, and calls us to remember that although God first chose the people of Israel, his saving power is to be revealed and proclaimed to all peoples and nations.

In the Gospel, the leper from Samaria, realizing he is healed, returns to Jesus. Jews considered Samaritans outcasts and enemies, but narrow boundaries for God's saving action do not exist for Jesus. Time and again he ignored expected behavior to bring God's love to all who were oppressed or considered beyond the fold of God's love. The Samaritan recognizes God at work in Jesus and glorifies his saving action. God's salvation is once again proclaimed to all people.

## From the Desk of Fr. Pascual

Dear Cathedral Basilica Ohana,

Greetings of peace, love, and joy!

***"Behold, I have prepared my banquet...Come to the feast."***

A banquet is a large meal or feast complete with [main courses](#) and [desserts](#). It usually serves a purpose such as a charitable gathering, a ceremony, or a [celebration](#), and is often preceded or followed by [speeches](#) in honor of someone. (*Source: Wikipedia*). We hear or read in our Gospel this Sunday about the Parable of the Marriage Feast. The king prepared a marriage feast for his son. When all were prepared, food, place, and the celebrant were ready; he sent his servants to call the guests. But they did not grace the occasion. He sent other servants, but in the same way, his invitation was not heeded. They even mistreated the servants. Since all were prepared, he sent his servants to go out in the streets to invite anyone, good and bad and filled up the hall. As the king roamed around, he noticed that one of those who came in was not in his wedding garment. So, he asked his attendants to bind him and cast him out into the darkness. At the end of the parable, Jesus said, "for many are called, but few are chosen."

We may immediately conclude that the king could have been more lenient about the man. Or, that the parable is about wearing the right outfit at a wedding banquet. But, the message of the parable goes beyond such things. It speaks more of God's invitation to the eternal banquet He has prepared, which is the banquet of eternal life. Such an invitation needs a response. If one responds to the invitation, he or she also needs to honor the invitee. How? By wearing the wedding garment, which symbolizes life in the ways of Christ, the Son.

Like the king in the parable, our Heavenly Father continues to invite us into His Kingdom. As we respond to His invitation, let us welcome it with joy and gratitude to share with us His eternal banquet. We may be unworthy of it, but His graciousness is overflowing. It is a matter of embracing it with fidelity to His Son, Jesus Christ. Also, to live every day, our call as disciples of the Lord. So, we ask ourselves, are we preparing enough to grace God's invitation?

May the Good and Loving Lord keep you always safe. May our Blessed Mother protect you always with her love and care and intercede for you during this difficult time.
